**LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR**

Dear Parishioners,

Forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven; every year we celebrate that event on the Feast of the Ascension. But before he ascended, our Savior promised to

remain with his Church "until the end of the age" (Matt 28:20). The most remarkable way in which he has fulfilled this promise is the topic of today's Gospel passage: the Holy Eucharist, which we celebrate during every Mass and receive through Holy Communion. To keep our human nature alive, we need natural food; to go without eating is to languish and die. But by our baptism we are no longer merely children of natural parents; we are also sons and daughters of God himself, sharers in his divine life. To sustain that supernatural life, then, we need supernatural food. Christ himself is that food. Just as children receive life and existence from their parents' flesh and blood at the moment of conception, so we receive Christian life and existence from Christ's flesh and blood in the Eucharist. During the Mass, when the ordained priest, in obedience to Christ's own command to "do this in remembrance of me," pronounces the words of consecration ("this is my body... this is my blood") over the bread and the wine, those humble substances are changed into Christ's own body and blood. This change is known by theologians as "transubstantiation," the transformation of the substance of bread and wine into the substance of Christ's body and blood. And since Christ is alive today, residing physically in heaven, wherever his body and blood are really present, he himself must also be present. Thus, the Church has always taught, and the faithful have always believed, that in the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, our God is truly and sacramentally present in his body, blood, soul, and divinity. This is one of the main distinctions between the different branches of Christianity. Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Christians have maintained the ancient faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. But during the Protestant Reformation, which took place in northern Europe in the 15 and 16 hundreds, the different Protestant groups stopped believing in the real presence. Martin Luther, John Calvin, Thomas Cranmer, John Knox - these and other reformers started their own churches, breaking away from the Catholic Church. During this period many different Protestant denominations began to appear: Lutherans, Presbyterians, Baptists. The Puritans who arrived on the shores of Massachusetts in the 1600s, the ones Americans call "the pilgrims," were a spinoff of these reformed churches. All of these new Christian groups continued to celebrate some kind of communion service in their Sunday worship, at least once or twice a year. But none of them believed firmly and clearly that Jesus was truly present in the Eucharist. They all taught that Jesus was only speaking symbolically when he said, as we heard in today's Gospel, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life." But if Jesus had been speaking of a mere symbol, and not a real sacrament, would he have referred to eating and drinking his flesh and blood seven times? Would he have made such an effort to explain that his flesh is "real food" and his blood "real drink" (verse 55)? Would he have used two different verbs to make sure he was understood: "phago" (verses, 50 & 51), which means to consume a meal, and then, after his listeners expressed shock and doubt, "trago" (verses 53-58), which means to gnaw, crunch, or chew, as when we eat raw vegetables, or when cattle graze on grass? No, Jesus meant exactly what he said: he is truly present in the Eucharist, because he loves us too much to abandon us.

## CARTA DE NUESTRO PÁRROCO

Queridos Feligreses,

Cuarenta días después de su resurrección, Jesucristo ascendió al cielo; cada año se celebra dicho evento en la fiesta de la ascensión. Pero antes de su ascensión, nuestro Salvador prometió permanecer con su iglesia "hasta el final de la edad" (Mat 28:20). Lo más notable en el que ha cumplido esta promesa es el tema del pasaje del Evangelio de hoy: la Santa Eucaristía, que celebramos en cada Misa y recibimos a través de la comunión. Para mantener nuestra naturaleza humana, necesitamos alimento natural; estar sin comer es languidecer y morir. Pero por nuestro bautismo ya no somos simplemente hijos de padres naturales; también somos hijos e hijas de Dios, partícipes de su vida divina. Para sostenernos en la vida sobrenatural, entonces, necesitamos alimento sobrenatural. Cristo mismo es esa comida. Igual que los niños reciben la vida y la existencia de la carne y sangre de sus padres en el momento de la concepción, así es que recibimos la vida cristiana y la existencia de Cristo con su carne y sangre en la Eucaristía. Durante la Misa, cuando el sacerdote ordenado, obedeciendo la orden de Cristo «haced esto en memoria mía,» pronuncia las palabras de la consagración ("Esto es mi cuerpo... esta es mi sangre") sobre el pan y el vino, se cambian esas sustancias humildes en el propio cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo. Este cambio se conoce por los teólogos como "transubstanciación", la transformación de la sustancia del pan y del vino en la sustancia del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo. Y puesto que Cristo está vivo hoy, que reside físicamente en el cielo, donde su cuerpo y su sangre están ahí está el realmente presente. Así, la Iglesia siempre ha enseñado, y los fieles siempre han creído, en la Eucaristía, bajo las apariencias del pan y del vino, nuestro Dios esta real y sacramentalmente presente su cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad. Esta es una de las principales distinciones entre las diferentes ramas del cristianismo. Católicos y cristianos ortodoxos del este han mantenido la antigua fe en la presencia real de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Pero durante la reforma protestante, que tuvo lugar en Europa del norte en años 15 y 16, los diferentes grupos protestantes dejaron de creer en la presencia real. Martin Lutero, Thomas Cranmer, John Calvin, y John Knox - estos y otros reformadores comenzaron sus propias iglesias, rompiendo con la iglesia católica. Durante este período muchos diferentes denominaciones protestantes comenzaron a aparecer: luteranos, presbiterianos, Bautistas. Los puritanos que llegaron a las costas de Massachusetts en la década de 1600, los americanos los llaman "los peregrinos", eran unas revueltas de estas iglesias reformadas. Todos estos nuevos grupos cristianos continuaron celebrando algún tipo de servicio de la comunión en el culto del domingo, por lo menos una o dos veces al año. Pero ninguno de ellos creía firmemente y claramente que Jesús estaba realmente presente en la Eucaristía. Todos enseñaban que Jesús sólo hablaba simbólicamente cuando dijo, como hemos escuchado en el Evangelio de hoy, "quien come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tiene vida eterna." ¿Pero si Jesús habría estado hablando de un mero símbolo y no de un sacramento real, se habría referido a comer y beber de su carne y la sangre siete veces? ¿Él no habría hecho tal esfuerzo para explicar que su carne y su sangre son "verdadera bebida" y "verdadera comida" (versículo 55)? Él habría utilizado dos verbos diferentes para asegurarse de que era entendido: "phago" (versos, 50- 51), que significa consumir una comida

y luego, después de que sus oyentes expresaron sorpresa y duda, "phago" (versos 53-58), que significa roer, o masticar, como cuando comemos crudo ¿vegetales, o cuando el ganado pasta en la hierba? No, Jesús sabía exactamente lo que dijo: él está verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía, porque nos ama demasiado como para abandonarnos.
