LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Jesus ends the long discourse on the Eucharist, and the disciples are struggling with believing in it because they don't understand it. It is the moment of decision. Today's 1st Reading, taken from Joshua, recalls a decisive moment for the people of God. The Exodus and forty years in the desert are over. They've not only entered the Promised Land under Joshua's leadership and with the Lord's help; they've conquered it. With a long journey behind them where the Lord not only accompanied and guided them but also worked great signs and wonders, they now had to decide whether they would still serve him or turn back to the gods they'd left behind. Joshua tells them they can do whatever they want, but he's already made his decision: he and his household will serve the Lord. Everything the Lord has offered is freely given, just as it is freely accepted. They're free to simply decide to go back to their old way of life, even though they'd be foolish to do so. The Israelites in the face of all the Lord has done for them acknowledge they'd be crazy to turn away from him now. However, as the Book of Judges reminds us, they soon did turn away from the Lord after Joshua passed away.

In today's 2nd Reading St. Paul reminds us that service implies being subordinate to another, and subordination is not always a bad thing. That last statement may rankle us, who pride

ourselves on our independence and self-reliance, but Our Lord teaches this by example. When Paul used the example of the husband being the head of the household, he points to the relationship between Our Lord and the Church to show how this should be lived. To use a more contemporary expression, there's no daylight between Christ and His Church, just as there should not be between husband and wife. Everyone should see them as one thing, no longer two, inseparable. Being subordinate to someone bears a greater responsibility on the part of the person to whom you're subordinate. Our Lord laid down his life for our wellbeing. He may call the shots, but he cherishes us, just as a husband should cherish his wife.

In today's Gospel, we see the culmination and the aftermath of Jesus' Bread of Life discourse. His teaching about the Eucharist presents the moment of decision for those who follow him because it requires faith, not just understanding. As a result, "many" disciples of Jesus return to their former way of life. Our Lord even poses the question to the Twelve, and Peter's response holds a lesson we should all consider in our own life of faith: belief is supported by grace, and it is through belief that we understand some of the deepest mysteries of God. If we try to start with reasons, as we've seen over the last few Sundays, some truths of God will remain out of reach for us, and we'll fall back on the certainties we know, as many of the disciples did in today's Gospel. We shouldn't be shy about asking Our Lord to help us in our unbelief. As Peter describes it in his response to Our Lord, believing leads to a conviction.

We can live a life of faith without understanding it thoroughly and, somehow, it all fits together. The Twelve, except Judas, is building on an experience of God and his mystery that they've had ever since they started following Jesus, which, in turn, was built on their understanding of God before Jesus' coming that had been lived and passed along throughout salvation history. These days you can submit a sample of your DNA and find out your ethnic origins, details on where your family originally came from, the migrations of your ancestors, and even people who you might not know are related to you. Just as each of us bears a genetic heritage spanning generations, we also carry a legacy of faith that unites us and connects us to our spiritual origins in Israel, the patriarchs, even Adam and Eve. The Lord prepared for the people of God and then established them at Mt. Sinai in the Old Testament, and Christ brought that heritage, along with the rest of the faithful of Israel, to us so that we could be part of it as well. If our genetic heritage marches onward in history, our legacy of faith depends on us and whether we want to maintain it in our lives, just like the Israelites in today's 1st Reading and the struggling disciples in today's Gospel. Joshua and Our Lord in today's readings invite us to trace the signs and wonders of salvation history all the way to their doorstep. The Israelites (in First Reading) could not deny all the Lord had done for them before asking them to renew their commitment to him. The Twelve, except Judas, did the same thing when Jesus tested their faith in him through the teaching of the Eucharist. If you've lived a life of faith, you can trace salvation history all the way from Adam and Eve to the spot on which you're standing. If you can't, it's not too late to retrace your steps and get back on track to the Promised Land. Our Lord will guide you

CARTA DE NUESTRO PÁRROCO

Queridos Feligreses,

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús termina un largo discurso sobre la Eucaristía, y los discípulos luchan por creer en él porque no lo entienden. Es el momento de la decisión. La 1ª lectura de hoy, tomada de Josué, nos recuerda un momento decisivo para el pueblo de Dios. Que el éxodo y cuarenta años en el desierto ya pasaron. Y no sólo han entrado a la tierra prometida bajo el liderazgo de Josué y con la ayuda del Señor; sino que lo han conquistado. Fue un largo viaje para ellos donde el Señor no sólo los acompañó y guio sino que también les dio grandes señales y prodigios, ahora tenían que decidir si todavía querían servirle o darse la vuelta y servir a los dioses que habían dejado atrás. Josué les dice que pueden hacer lo que quieran, pero él ya ha tomado su decisión: él y su familia servirán al Señor. Todo lo que el Señor ofrece se da libremente, y libremente se acepta. Son libres para simplemente decidir volver a su antigua forma de vida, a pesar de que sería absurdos hacerlo. Ante todo lo que el Señor ha hecho por ellos, los Israelitas reconocen que sería una locura apartarse de él ahora. Sin embargo, como nos recuerda el libro de jueces, ellos pronto se dieron la vuelta lejos del Señor después de que Josué murió. En la actualidad en la segunda lectura San Pablo nos recuerda que el servicio implica ser subordinado a otro y la subordinación no siempre es mala. Esta última afirmación puede irritar, a los que nos enorgullecemos de nuestra independencia y autosuficiencia, pero nuestro Señor enseña este ejemplo. Cuando Pablo utiliza el ejemplo del esposo que es la cabeza de la casa, señala la relación entre nuestro Señor y la iglesia para mostrar cómo debe vivirse. Y utiliza una expresión más contemporánea, todo es claridad entre Cristo y su iglesia, así como debe haber claridad entre marido y mujer. Todo el mundo debería verlos como inseparables, ya no dos. Estar subordinado a una persona lleva una responsabilidad mayor por parte de la persona a quien se está subordinado. Nuestro Señor dio su vida por nuestro bienestar. Él puede decir la última palabra, pero nos aprecia, igual que un esposo debe apreciar a su esposa. En el Evangelio de hoy vemos la culminación y después del discurso de Jesús pan de vida. Su enseñanza sobre la Eucaristía presenta el momento de decisión para los que lo siguen porque se requiere de fe, no sólo de entender. Como resultado, "muchos" de los discípulos de Jesús regresan a su antigua forma de vida. Nuestro Señor incluso plantea la pregunta a los doce, y la respuesta de Pedro tiene una lección que todos debemos considerar en nuestra vida de fe: la creencia es apoyada por la gracia, y es a través de la creencia es que entendemos algunos de los más profundos misterios de Dios. Si intentamos comenzar con razonamientos, como hemos visto en los últimos pocos domingos, algunas verdades de Dios seguirán siendo inalcanzables para nosotros, y vamos a caer nuevamente en las certezas que ya conocemos, como muchos de los discípulos en el Evangelio de hoy. No deberíamos ser tímidos pidiendo a nuestro Señor que nos ayude en nuestra incredulidad. Como Pedro lo describe en su respuesta a nuestro Señor, la creencia nos conduce a la convicción. Podemos vivir una vida de fe sin entender muy bien y, de alguna manera, todo encaja. Los doce, excepto Judas, partiendo de una experiencia con Dios y su misterio es que se han mantenido desde que empezaron a seguir a Jesús, y a su vez, fueron construyendo su comprensión en Dios, antes de venir Jesús había vivido y pasado a lo largo de historia de la salvación. Estos días puedes enviar una muestra de tu ADN y averiguar tus orígenes étnicos, detalles de donde viene tu familia originalmente, y sus antepasados y aún la gente que no se sabe si se relacionan con usted. Así como cada uno de nosotros tiene un patrimonio genético que abarca generaciones, también tenemos un legado de fe que nos une y nos conecta con nuestros orígenes espirituales en Israel, los patriarcas, incluso Adán y Eva. Que El

Señor había preparado para el pueblo de Dios y había establecido entonces en el Monte Sinaí, en el Antiguo Testamento Cristo trajo ese patrimonio, junto con el resto de los fieles de Israel, nos trajeron para que podamos ser parte de ello también. Si nuestro patrimonio genético marcha hacia adelante en la historia, nuestro legado de la fe depende de nosotros y si queremos mantenerlo en nuestras vidas, al igual que los israelitas en la 1ª lectura y a los discípulos que luchan en el Evangelio de hoy. Josué y nuestro Señor en las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a recobrar los signos y maravillas de la historia de la salvación hasta su puerta. Los israelitas (en la primera lectura) no pueden negar lo que el Señor había hecho por ellos antes de pedirles que renovaran su compromiso con él. Los doce, excepto Judas, hicieron lo mismo cuando Jesús probó su fe en él a través de la enseñanza de la Eucaristía. Si has vivido una vida de fe, puedes trazar la historia de la salvación desde Adán y Eva hasta el lugar en el que estas de pie. ¡Si puedes! no es demasiado tarde para volver al camino a la tierra prometida. En Nuestro Señor te guiará.
